Larissa Zoubareva is a Registered Music Teacher with The Royal Conservatory of Music (Advanced Certified Teacher in Piano) and with the Ontario Registered Music Teachers Association. She is a Registered Psychotherapist - an Accredited Music Therapist.

Larissa Zoubareva received a Master of Music degree in Piano Performance and a Master of Arts degree in Methods of Teaching Piano Music from the Belarus State Academy of Music. Since then, as a professional, her motto remains as, "the sky is the limit as are our opportunities to improve and grow". In 2000, Larissa established Larissa's Studio of Piano Music in Mississauga. Then in 2002, she became active as an executive member in the Etobicoke-Mississauga branch of the Ontario Registered Music Teachers' Association (ORMTA) during which time she received an Outstanding Contribution to Teaching Award (OCTA). Larissa has written articles describing the innovative concept of developing musicians' feelings, and imaginative thinking, that have been published in various sources. These writings combined with her teaching and performing experience have triggered many questions about the influence of music on human beings and thus inspired her to complete a Masters in Music Therapy Degree at Wilfrid Laurier University in 2016.
